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Sureśvara as a Commentator

Sureśvara was a direct student of Śańkara and a celebrated commentator of some his works. He authored Naiskarmya Siddhi, an independent work, and two vārttikas: on Śańkara's Bṛhadāraṇyakopaniṣad-bhāṣya and Taittirīyopaniṣad-bhāṣya. It appears from his works that he was a thorough and consistent Śańkarite who scarcely allowed diversion from the line of his master. Throughout his career Sureśvara debated with Mīmāṃsakas, both the Bhāṭṭas and the Prābhākaras. He also confronted the followers of Maṇḍana Miśra, a non-Śańkarite and famous *prasaṃkhyānavādin*. One of the major topics of debate that is found in each and every of his works is vindication of the insight into the nature of self (*jñāna*) as the sole means of achieving liberation. In his works, he proves himself to be a seasoned polemicist and a scholar of tremendous erudition. Sureśvara acts as a valuable link between Śańkara and the later Advaita tradition.
