Vienna is home to two long-established hubs of Tibetological research: the Institute for the Cultural and Intellectual History of Asia (IKGA) at the Austrian Academy of Sciences, and the Department of South-Asian, Tibetan and Buddhist Studies (ISTB) at the University of Vienna.
